The meeting was called to order at 5:30p.m. by Pres. Mike VanEss.

Secretary's Minutes: Minutes approved (motion Chris G., seconded Linda Z.)

Correspondence: Sturgeon Bay High School seeking donations to finance greenhouse for students. Mike to email DCMGA membership advising of request.

Treasurer's Report: Wendy passed out copies of current reports. Reports approved (motion Linda Z, sec. Holly G.)

Appointment of new Board member: Dorry Wilner to replace Jim Baxter. Appointment approved (motion Jim F., sec. Alan R.)

Old Business: Vicki Dirst has ordered the teak bench as a memorial for Tom Kile. A plaque is to be made. Purchase was approved previously. Plaques also needed for Rod Bohn chairs.

New Business: Appointment of Chris Gritzmacher and Helen Bacon as Open House Co-Chairmen approved (motion by Jim F., sec. Dorry W.)

Goal Setting: Bill Freyman, Mike VanEss, Holly Green, Jan Zieman, Annie Deutsch, and Mike Zolnosky reviewed current goals and revised them for 2017. Updated Goals report on website.

Copy attached. DCMGA Procedures will be reviewed at the May meeting.

PARS Meeting: Discussed and accepted was the annual agreement with PARS (motion Linda Z., sec. Jim F.) Also discussed was the Community Garden Rules and Guidelines for The Garden Next Door. Timing of produce/plant removal was questioned. Motion made to approve guidelines (motion Holly G., sec. Wendy W.) PARS has requested a donation of \$2500 to defray operating costs. Motion made and passed to make the requested donation in 2017 and to include same amount in DCMGA budget for 2018 (motion Jim F., sec. Dorry W.)

Fall Fundraiser: Mike suggested restarting the fall bulb sale that the DC tourism board ended several years ago. Sales would be preorders only. Also discussed were tours of the Garden Door that would produce donations.

Committee Reports:

Plant Sale: Plant lists are out and orders from MGs must be submitted by April. Greenhouse meeting and first planting March 18 at 9 a.m.

Education: Two programs for April: mushrooms, and pollinators. Monthly programs on WDOR radio have been scheduled starting in April. The lavender garden tour on Washington Island is being planned.

Training: Class is going well.

Garden Door: Discussion of management groups for garden areas, attraction of new members, schedule of work events, Monday morning coffee work group, barriers to being an area supervisor, Tuesday talks in the garden – four scheduled for the summer. Possible inclusion in annual House and Garden Walk – Matt to be consulted about traffic. Path committee is getting bids (for information only), possible funding (grants) available for pollinator plantings.

Open House: Helen B. presented many ideas for the Open House, scheduled for July 8, including having a Garden Fair theme. Personnel from the DC Extension office expressed interest in participating.

Publicity: Mike V. and Jan Gigstead have been sharing tasks, with Jan taking photos of events. DCMGA will have a display at the Sturgeon Bay Library in May and August to promote events. Mike requests photos from MGs for the display.

Education: A display will be in the library in January, promoting the evening talks at Crossroads.

Merchandise Sales: Sale of logo clothing is coming up.

Youth: DCMGA will continue working with the Boys and Girls Club this year.

Outreach: An application to volunteer at Potawatomi State Park for work in the flower beds was received and approved (motion Linda Z., sec. Jim F.)

Sunshine: A sympathy card will be sent to Jean Emke re: the passing of her husband.

State Report: UW-Extension still having problems with background check process. No information on how budget cuts will affect staffing at PARS or the Extension Office.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:54 p.m. (motion Jim F., sec. Alan R.)

Garden Door Notes by Vicki Dirst

Garden Door Committee Meeting March 13, 2017

Call to Order: Jim B. called the meeting to order at 5:30.

Treasurers Report: Nancy said we have spent nothing since the last meeting.

Open Positions: Jim B. said we still need people to take over the pond garden and rose garden. Carrie indicated some in the new class might be interested in taking over an area. Mike talked about his work on QR codes to enable visitors to quickly access our website. Vickie asked if anyone has used a computer program for mapping. No one has.

Garden Plant Lists: Jim B. said we are still lacking some plant lists and annual reports. He added that last year he made a map of the grass garden, and he urged others to map their areas.

Phase II Paver Project: At the last meeting Mike recommended that we take no action on upgrading the paths until at least 2018. Doug reiterated the motion he made at the November meeting that the paver committee proceed to get bids for additional paving. The motion was approved in November and again in this meeting.

Tom Kile Donation: Jim B. said Lucy favors a bench. Vicki will order a hardwood bench from Hayneedle. Mike will obtain an engraved plaque for the bench. Doug asked where the bench will go. Alan said the location need not be determined right now.

Grounds Coordinator: Alan said we need to find a new grounds coordinator, since he will be done in November. He offered to train his successor.

Garden Bed Boundaries: Alan has asked some supervisors to identify the boundaries of their gardens. Knowing the boundaries can make it easier to turn over the gardens to new people. Vickie asked Alan about a pipe she discovered in her garden. She also asked about whether there is a need to get approval to cut down any trees. Alan said it should be brought to the committee for discussion.

Rack Cards: Mike reported we are almost out of rack cards. He asked if any changes should be made before he gets them reprinted. The peony garden and conifer garden were noted. There was some discussion regarding the selection of peonies for extended bloom time.

Library Display Case: Mike has asked Jan Gigstead to reserve our use of the library display case for May. He talked about the types of content that might be included, and asked how we would like to feature TGD. Contact him if you have ideas. Jim B. suggested the existing slide show, providing electrical service is available.

Training Class Presentation: Several people gave a presentation to the class in January. Carrie said some in the class have asked how to connect with people managing the different gardens. She asked supervisors to reach out to the class members on the list they were given. The spring cleanup is May 18th.

Supervisor Duties/Expectations: Jim B. wants to make the garden more attractive to volunteers. He said we need to diminish the psychological barriers: fear of not knowing enough, fear of being criticized, fear of getting stuck with one area in perpetuity, and not knowing what you are getting into. He welcomes ideas on how to accomplish this.

Pollinator Plantings: The "Bayer Feed a Bee" program provides grants to organizations or individuals for plantings to support pollinators. Chriss D. and Wendy expressed interest.

Annual Meeting with Matt Staziak: Jim B. reported on the annual meeting. Matt was unhappy with the level of maintenance in the Garden Next Door. Matt also said we were not welcome to access the compost pile without further discussing the matter with him. Chris G. said we should get some compost if we can, but we would have to keep our pile weeded. Deborah offered to weed a compost pile. Mike said the agreement with PARS was reviewed and not changed. Minor changes were made to the Garden Next Door agreement regarding the date for completion of fall cleanup and the control of insects and disease. Parking during weekdays was also discussed. Matt asked that we give PARS a donation of \$2,500. This will be discussed at the board meeting. Doug advised that if you want to have input, come to the board meeting.

Open House: Helen talked about the Open House on July 8th 1-4:00. She and Chris G. have talked about presenting this as a garden fair. The idea is to feature more information on vegetable gardening, more involvement of the UW-Extension, a tent displaying flower arranging in different styles and a tent informing people on how to prepare entries for the Door County Fair. In addition, Helen suggested information on sun safety (provided by someone from public health) plus a sun hat contest to win a prize. Other thoughts include a children's activity tent (involving 4-H and the Boys and Girls Club), plant health advisors, composting, raised bed gardening, trellises, growing onions, growing garlic and growing potatoes in a sack.



Then we would need approval from the House and Garden Walk organizers. On the day of the event we would need tour guides and parking assistance.

The meeting adjourned at 7:06.


