Secretary's Report: Minutes approved (motion Linda Z., sec. Jim F.)

Treasurer's Report: Wendy provided report copies, said final accounting for the plant sale is not complete.

Old Business

Fund Raising: The Flower Power promotion discussed, several questions raised about privacy of email address lists, quality of product. Linda Z. volunteered to research further, motion made to pursue promotion (Wendy W., sec. Dorry). Motion passed.

House and Garden Walk Update: Hours for Walk are 9-5, volunteers in place (combination of HGW organizers and MGs).

Board Leadership: Several positions will need to be filled, including President, Vice-President, etc. Suggestions for candidates requested by Pres. Mike V.

New Business

John Bamberg Email – Discussion: Recent email from USDA rep regarding future of Research Station, Potato Genebank, The Garden Door, and DCMGA relationship discussed. Pres. Mike V. recommended tabling discussion of questions and plans for now.

Interpretive Sign for TGD: Funding needed for "Pollinators in the Garden" signage and stand. Grant from WIMGA for \$250 received for partial funding. Motion made to allocate up to an additional \$200 to purchase said signage/equipment (Motion by Dorry W./sec. Wendy W.) Motion passed.
2017-2019 Budget: The budget runs from Oct. 1 – Sept. 30. A balanced budget will be submitted/reviewed at September Board meeting. Budget requests are to be submitted to Wendy Woldt, with the exception that TGD budget requests go to Nancy Anschutz.

Committee Reports

Open House: Chris G. has written a report form for this year's Open House. She will ask co-chairperson Helen Bacon to submit a report as well. Attendance was reported at 138. Suggestions included changing the event hours to morning rather than afternoon, and to choose a date not so close to July 4. Chris G. sent out thank you notes to participants.

Garden Door: How to address weed problem in brick walks, Monday Mornings in the Garden and Tuesdays in GD doing well, more participation from new class members, a bus tour showed up during the Weed & Feed event, a new Grounds Coordinator needed, as well as a Pond Garden Area Supervisor.

Plant Sale: Approximately \$28,000 taken in at Plant Sale. Receipts for costs are still coming in. A discussion of how to organize leadership duties is ongoing. Karen Kidd has been able to recruit some individuals willing to take on leadership roles.

Education: Washington Island tour was a success; plans being made for Winter/Spring Educational Series.

Annual Meeting: New person needed to organize annual meeting.

Training: Student garden tours scheduled for July 23, Graduation Picnic for August 20.

Newsletter: Jeanne White has requested to do newsletter on a quarterly basis.

Youth: Few MG volunteers for their programs. Should DCMGA change its relationship with the Boys and Girls Club?

Merchandise Sales: Chriss D. noted good sales at the Plant Sale.

Outreach: No report.

Publicity: DCMGA has the Sturgeon Bay Library display case for August and January. A suggestion was made to post a flyer regarding the Tuesday programs on the shed in TGD. **Social:** No report.

Sunshine: No report.

State Report: Background checks are due October 1.

The next Board meeting will be Wednesday, September 20, 2017 at 5:30 p.m at the PARS classroom.

Garden Door Committee Meeting July 10, 2017

Members present: Jim Baxter, Mike VanEss, Chriss Daubner, JoAnn Tarczewski, Barb Hinkelman, Barb Henderson, Doug Henderson, John Werblow, Alan Romsos, Chris Gritzmacher

The meeting was called to order by Jim Baxter at 5:30 pm.

The minutes from the May 8 meeting were approved.

Wendy W. reported that The Garden Door expenses for the current fiscal year are \$5,398.86. Jim B. encouraged area supervisors to submit their expenses to Nancy A.

Old Business

Open Garden Areas: Chris G. reported that Nick Doane is taking over the Rose Garden. Someone still needs to fill the Pond Garden position.

- Grounds Coordinator Position: At this time, no one has stepped forward to accept this position. Jim B. noted that this is an essential position.
- Plant List Updates: Mike V. reported that he has received updates for some garden areas. He encouraged area supervisors to provide updates so that the plant lists on the web remain accurate. He noted that statistics on the website show that people are accessing the plant areas page that contains the links to the plant lists. Currently, this page is getting the third most page views on our website.

New Paved Paths: Doug H. indicated that there is nothing to report.

New Business

- Interpretive Sign: Mike V. passed around a copy of the interpretive sign that he has designed. He reminded everyone that the theme for this year's sign is Pollinators in the Garden. It was suggested that the honey bee pictured be replaced with a bumble bee. Mike said that the stand needs to be ordered. Once everything is complete, he will work with Alan to have it installed in the garden.
- Grounds Coordinator Report: Alan R. reported that he has had to deal with problems with the water system. One valve malfunctioned and had to be replaced. He noted that he still does not know where all of the valves are located in the garden. If additional valves fail, they will need to be searched out. Alan also reported numbers from the counter. He noted significant differences between the entry and exit numbers. Alan suspects that the counter is malfunctioning. He noted that the counter was designed to work indoors not outdoors.
- Invasives: Jim B. reported that we removed the burning bush from his garden area. He expressed his feeling that we should not always remove invasive plants from the Grass garden. Instead we should leave them and label them as invasive as an educational tool. No further discussion occurred on this topic.

New Artwork/Signage: Jim thanked the Hendersons for producing replacements for the DCMGA logos on the front entry arbor. Alan is in the process of refinishing the frames that hold these signs. They have also replaced some of the garden area tiles that were faded. They encouraged any area supervisors who feel their tiles should be replaced to let them know.

Paved Path Maintenance: Jim noted that weeds are starting to poke up between pavers. Options for addressing this were discussed, but no decision was made.

- Work Assignment Sheet: Jim indicated that he does not feel this is being used. He noted that the success of the Monday Morning Coffee in the Garden might have made it less necessary to use the assignment sheets.
- TGD Strategic Plan: Jim noted that this plan has grown out of date. He suggested we look at it at the September TGD Committee meeting.

Monday Morning Coffee: Jim reported that this has been a popular addition, with 10-12 members participating each time. This has helped keep the garden in good shape. We will keep this going each Monday through the end of August.

- Tuesday in The Garden Door: The first installment went well last month. We had about 30 people attend the event. The next installment will happen tomorrow (July 11).
- Weed 'n Feed: The June Weed 'n Feed did not go well. The original date was rained out, and the rain date was not well attended. Despite this, the garden looks great. The next Weed 'n Feed is scheduled for 7/18 at 9:00 am. This was moved up one week from the original date to accommodate the House & Garden Walk.

No other items were brought up for discussion. Next Meeting: Monday, September 11, 2017, 5:30 pm at PARS Meeting was adjourned at 6:10 pm Submitted by: Mike VanEss

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

Field Trip to Washington Island

On Wednesday, July 12th, Master Gardeners travelled to Washington Island to view three educational properties:

Fragrant Isle Lavender Farm, Sweet Mountain Farm and The Homestead & Gathering Ground.



Fragrant Isle is an incredibly beautiful lavender farm featuring wonderfully fragrant gardens and a gift shop complete with lavender themed gifts and food items.



Sweet Mountain Farm features Russian Honeybees that are mite resistant, hygienic and cold hardy. A colony can produce as much as 100lbs of honey. They distribute their products at a number of retail locations throughout the county, or shoppers can order online at the Sweet Mountain Farm website.



The Homestead & Gathering Ground consists of 35 acres devoted to a vineyard, school garden and woods. The vision of this group is to cultivate and inspire ecologicallyminded agriculture and partnership with land and people.

Master Gardeners thoroughly enjoyed their visit to Washington Island and returned with plenty of food for thought!
